#### A Regulatory Assessment for the Arab Region










#### **ABLF- Competition Chapter**

Methodology: 8 main evaluation categories that included 62 indicators aligned with 7 core elements.

Assessment: 20 Competition laws were evaluated, resulting in 1 General Competition Chapter and 20 related country profiles.

Result: Arab region score changed from Average to Advanced. 10 countries demonstrated improvements, while the scores of 10 others remained unchanged.






### Training workshop for the staff of the Libyan Competition and Anti-Monopoly Council



**A Dashboarding Tool** 






# 4th Session of the Committee on Trade Policy
