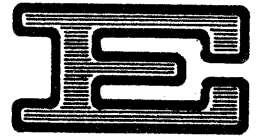

FINANCIAL STATUS OF THE COMMISSION'S PROGRAMME

TRUST FUND FOR ESCWA REGIONAL ACTIVITIES

Note by the Executive Secretary

BACKGROUND

1. In its review of the programme of work at its second session, the Commission noted that the level of resources provided by the regular programme budget was inadequate to meet the programme needs particularly for the great number of projects requested for the region; the provision of extrabudgetary resources was therefore necessary to a successful implementation of the Commission's programme of work. In resolution 11(II), the Commission requested a report on the most efficient and effective mode for establishing a fund financed from voluntary contributions to be used for extrabudgetary financing of the work programme, and for meeting requests by member States for studies and advisory services.

2. In paragraphs 1 and 2 of its resolution 33(III), the Commission established a voluntary fund and requested that the resources of the fund be utilized to finance services in fields of economic and social development in favour of the least developed States members of the Commission.

3. At its fourth session, the Commission, in resolution 45(IV), inter alia, urged member States to make voluntary contributions towards the general financing of the work programme or the financing of specific projects. In paragraph 4 of that resolution, the Commission called upon the Executive Secretary to submit a financial statement of the Fund at each session; the present report is in response to that request.

I. CONTRIBUTIONS

4. In response to the Commission's resolution 33(III), the Trust Fund for ECWA Regional Activities was established by the Secretary-General in 1976. The status of contributions received from 1976 to 31 December 1985 is presented below:

5. Paragraph 3 of Commission resolution 45(IV) requests the Executive Secretary to invite member States of the Commission, six months before the date of each session, to determine the amount of their contributions towards the resources of the Fund.

6. In accordance with the procedure established by the Secretary-General and approved by the General Assembly, an annual pledging conference is held at United Nations Headquarters in New York, during which all States Members of the United Nations are requested to announce their contributions to all programmes and funds established in the United Nations. The aims and objectives of the ESCWA Trust Fund for Regional Activities, together with the activities undertaken, are listed in the document containing background information on programmes and funds, and made available to all Member States before the conference.

7. Based on information received from the Conference, no contribution was pledged and/or received for the Fund at the pledging conference in 1985.

II. PROGRAMME OF ACTIVITIES FINANCED FROM THE FUND

8. At its second session, the Commission, in its resolution 11(II), set out the objective of the Fund as a source of revenue for the extrabudgetary financing of the work programme and for meeting requests by member States for studies and advisory services. At its third session, the Commission, in paragraph 2 of its resolution 33(III), circumscribed the utilization of the resources of the Fund to the various fields of economic and social development in favour of the least developed States members of the Commission. At the seventh session, the Commission expanded the area of activities to be financed from the resources of the Fund to include surveys and statistical research, analytical studies, training, consultant's services, and all economic and social sectors and subsectors.

9. In accordance with the above objectives, the activities financed from the Fund, from its inception in 1976 to 31 December 1985, are as follows:
