Challenges Facing Arab Youth

Educational Barriers

Limited access to quality education hinders active youth engagement in sustainable development initiatives.

Economic Obstacles

Unemployment and financial instability among youth act as barriers to their active participation in sustainable development efforts.

Arab youth face a lack of awareness and resources for sustainable environmental development.

Statistical Insights

Challenge	Data/Statistics
Limited Access to Education	According to UNESCO, the Arab region has the highest youth illiteracy rate in the world, with 15% of youth aged 15-24 unable to read or write.
High Unemployment Rates	The International Labour Organization (ILO) reports that Arab countries have the highest youth unemployment rates globally, with an average rate of 30.6% in 2020.
Lack of Political Representation	Arab youth are significantly underrepresented in political decision making. The Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) states that only 2.7% of Arab parliamentarians are under the age of 30.
Limited Access to Information	The Arab Barometer Survey reveals that 33% of Arab youth feel that they have limited access to information, hindering their ability to engage in decision making processes.
Socio-cultural Barriers	Traditional norms and cultural expectations often limit the participation of Arab youth in decision making. For example, gender inequality and age hierarchies can restrict their involvement.

Challenges in Climate Change Negotiations

1 Limited Representation

Arab youth are poorly represented in climate change negotiations and discussions.

2 Knowledge Gaps

There is insufficient understanding of climate change issues and negotiation processes among Arab youth.

3 Financial Constraints

Limited access for youth to training and resources necessary for effective participation in climate change negotiations.



Recommendations and Solutions

Empowerment through Education

Integrate sustainable development and peacebuilding topics into educational curricula to build the capacities of young people.

Create leadership programs for youth to train them as negotiators in climate change issues and peace initiatives.

1 Training Programs

Implement targeted training to equip youth with negotiation skills for climate change discussions.

2 COP Participation

Ensure youth representation at Conference of Parties (COP) to voice their perspectives.

3 Policy Impact

Empower them to influence policies directly related to sustainability and peace.

Nominating UN youth delegates provides a global platform for Arab youth voices.

Policy Engagement

It facilitates direct engagement with international policy-making.

Leadership Skills

This experience fosters leadership skills and international diplomacy.

ENHANCE PARTICIPATION

Work to strengthen inclusion, participation, and represent-tation of youth in climate processes, formal policymaking and decision-making in climate conferences and meetings

INSTILL EDUCATION

Empower youth's capacity to usefully contribute to decision-making through awareness, capacity-building and education opportunities

AMPLIFY VOICES

Relay and amplify voices and policy proposals of youth within the Presidency, UNFCCC and beyond

SPUR ACTION

Leverage COP to advance, resource, and monitor youth-led climate action, enabling funding and ensuring accountability

MONITOR AND EVALUATE

Promote accountability, transparency and continuity across years in youth policy and programmes related to Presidencies and UNFCCC
