Introduction:


(PCBS) conducted the Business Survey on ICT for the first time in 2007.

The second round was conducted in 2009 and the third round was conducted in 2011



- <u>Enriching ICT statistical data</u> on the actual use and access by the economic establishments of ICT.
- <u>Identifying the characteristics of the tools and means of ICT used in the economic activity</u>, the type of economic activity and size of establishments.
- <u>Providing opportunity for international and regional comparisons</u> that help in determining the location of the State of Palestine among the technological world countries.
- Assisting planners and policy makers in understanding the status of the Technology-Based Economy in Palestine, which helps to meet the future needs of the Palestinian economy.

- Advanced technologies such as (AI, Robotics, Big data analysis, 3D printing and IoT).
