The session will focus on debt data compilation and reporting and methodology of debt data quality assessment for debt sustainability analysis. The methodology to assess debt data quality will be presented together with the tool for identifying deficiencies in debt database and the correction measures to be adopted. Main challenges and needs for improvement in data quality and coordination between entities for improving debt management will be discussed, including governance and institutional arrangements for debt management.
