


Institutional coherence as a precondition for policy coherence

- Systematically identify relevant linkages across the sectors and domains and consider those linkages in design of policies;
- Policies need to be consistent across sectors and scales (from local to global);
- Engagement of relevant stakeholders in design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation;
- Adequate resources are provided for implementation at all levels and at all scales

Strategic Foresight






- From a command-and control hierarchical center towards an organized systematic way of looking beyond the expected to engage with uncertainty and complexity
- Common understanding of the future based on a comprehensive scan of what drives change currently
- Multi-stakeholder perspective
- Consensus building towards joint vision of a common desirable future
- Explore possible futures


Institutional change does not mean a change of rules and goals per se. It also implies <u>changing the beliefs</u> <u>and attitudes (mindsets), and values</u> <u>of public servants</u> to reorient behavior to attain those goals. Above all, it means behavioral changes as mindsets also impact actions and decision making.
