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Overview

This session will involve Working Group discussions of the Strategy's baselines and targets with the aim of identifying data and ensuring actionable targets.

Guiding Principles for a Strategy

- Employing a human rights-based and survivor-centered approach
- Acknowledging that violence against women and girls as a form of discrimination
- Acknowledging different forms of violence against women and girls
- Acknowledging the root causes, prevalence and impact of violence against women and girls
- Addressing multiple and intersecting forms of discrimination and disadvantage

Identify root causes, prevalence and impact of violence against women and girls


 Draw on and include international research on the root causes, nature and impact of violence against women and girls worldwide


 Collate and communicate data and research on the nature, prevalence and impact of different forms of violence against women and girls, and identify gaps for future work

Baselines

- Begin with what is known quantitatively and qualitatively concerning the root causes, nature, prevalence and impact of violence against women and girls.
- Establish this baseline data in key areas in the early stages of the Strategy's implementation.
- Demonstrate the different forms and intersections of violence against women and girls, identify gaps in knowledge, and set a baseline against which progress can be measured.


Identifying sources of data on violence against women and girls











Generating and Collecting Data


Sources of Qualitative Data

- Open-ended interviews
- Oral histories / life histories
- Focus group discussions and consultations
- Reports
- In-depth case studies
- Discourse or content analysis
- Legal analysis
- Secondary data

Sources of Quantitative Data

- Surveys / polls / questionnaires
- Statistics
- Closed interviews
- Observations
- Document review and secondary data
