Statement on, and the strengthening of, the Financial Contributions Account

- 1. In accordance with paragraph 4 of Commission resolution 45(IV), the statement on the utilization of the Financial Contributions Account as at 31 December 1980 is annexed hereto. It provides information on the use of the Account since its establishment.
- 2. Since the last statement was issued (E/ECWA/100) on the occasion of the seventh session, the following new 1980 programmed activities were allotted funds from the Account: (a) the management, conservation and development of agricultural resources; (b) regional co-operation in the capital goods and heavy engineering industries; and (c) studies on the Arab "brain drain". In addition, two ongoing projects (Statistical series and indicators; and Economic co-operation and integration in Western Asia) received further allocations during the year.
- 3. Up to the end of 1980, a total of 21 projects have benefited from the Financial Contributions Account since its establishment. Of these, 5 were still in progress and 16 had been completed. The projects covered a variety of activities carried out under various programmes. The Account has clearly been of paramount importance to the secretariat, enabling it to provide complementary resources to the work programme of the Commission, for which inadequate resources were available under the regular budget. It further provided the secretariat with a flexible tool to respond to requests from member States.
- 4. The following unspent balances from 1980 will be expended in 1981 in the projects listed below:

It is clear that, with the continued pattern of utilization as established over the years, the Financial Contributions Account will be exhausted early in the biennium 1982-1983, or more likely during this biennium. Hence, member States may wish to take steps to strengthen the Account.

8. In commexion with the status of the Financial Contributions Account reference is made to operative para.1 of resolution 79 (VII) which urges all member States to strengthen the Financial Contributions Account of ECWA, so that the Commission may discharge its responsibilities vis-à-vis the growing needs of the member States and so that its activities, ranging from surveys and statistical research to analytical studies and training and consultant services, can be extended to cover all economic and social sectors and subsectors". There has been no response to this resolution. However, as is shown in document E/ECWA/117, an amount of \$5,864,

constituting the balance of a contribution of the Yemen Arab Republic to assist in the organization of its Development Conference in 1977, was, at the request of the Government, deposited in the Account.

- The strengthening of the Account could be pursued in a variety of ways in line with the established procedures of the United Nations. In this connexion, it is to be noted that, following the adoption of General Assembly resolution 32/197, the Secretariat is called upon to organize all fund-raising activities for operationa activities in one United Nations Pledging Conference for Development Activities, at which where member States can pledge contributions to the various trust funds operated by the United Nations. The Financial Contributions Account figures on the list of trust funds established for this purpose by the secretariat at United Nations Headquarters. The annual United Nations Pledging Conference was held in November 1980. It could, thus, be envisaged that the strengthening of the Account by member States might be effected through the machinery already established, namely the United Nations Pledging Conference for Development Activities. secretariat believes, however, that the primary mechanism for strengthening the Account should continue to be the annual sessions of the Commission under the standing agenda item established for this purpose. Under this item, member States could announce their intention to contribute to the Account and this could be formalized within the context of the annual United Nations Pledging Conference for Development Activities. If it were desirable, the ECVA secretariat could submit annually specific programme areas for pledging purposes in the light of the observations made following the consideration of the status of the Commission's programmes and its programme of work and priorities.
- 10. The immediate programme needs requiring additional resources follow from:
 - (a) The zero-growth policy of the United Nations, which does not allow for adequate programme development. In this connexion, the Commission was informed, under item 8 of the provisional agenda, that a number of

priority programmes and services submitted by the secretariat will not be proposed by the Secretary-General to the legislative organs of the United Nations for the appropriation of funds. These include the following:

(i) Programme for the development of statistical services \$ 57,000

(ii) Electronic data processing services

\$ 172,000

(iii) Computer equipment

\$ 500,000

(iv) Programme for the least developed countries

(b) The inadequacy of funding for technical co-operation projects. In this connexion, reference is made to document E/ECWA/120/Add.2. in which the secretariat lists a number of technical co-operation projects already formulated but for which the necessary funding is not available. The total requirement for such projects, excluding the Arab Urban Development Institute (AUDI), amounts to \$1,217,000.

11. The computer equipment mentioned in paragraph 10 is intended for installation in the permanent ECWA headquarters at Baghdad. Five broad areas have been identified as susceptible to the application of electronic data processing, namely:

- (a) Econometrics:
- (b) Statistics:
- (c) Information retrieval;
- (d) Word processing;
- (e) Administration.

The estimate of the cost of equipment is based upon a configuration of the IBM system 4331. This particular manufacturer was selected because both the Geneva-based International Computing Centre and the New York Computing Centre have standardized on IBM equipment; thus, ECWA would have access to other United Nations data and software with the minimum of modification for the Commission's

specific configuration. An example of available software is the CDS/ISIS data entry and retrieval on-line sub-system, using the IBM Customer Information Control System, currently installed in 53 institutions in member States, including 7 United Nations and 5 international organizations.

In the present climate of budgetary restrictions, the United Nations regional commissions can only look to external donors to finance the equipment needed to bring modern techniques to bear upon the problems of their respective regions. A recent example of such financing is the donation of \$ 1 million by Japan to the United Nations Economic Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP) for the acquisition of a computer.
