# 11:00 – 12:30 **Session 5: Regulating FT**

The heterogeneous impact of FT on local employment, societies, economic activity and governments varies across regions as populations, educational systems and economic structures are different: one size does not fit all. Governments must lead in ensuring FTs are of maximum benefit to local sustainable development, while minimizing adverse side effects. FTs are embedded in daily life, using local data, markets, and human resources indiscriminately. How can localized FT solutions add maximum value by recognizing regional and domestic specificities? Regulation is needed to facilitate proper transfer and deployment, while preventing abuses in the realms of security, privacy, safety, ethics and culture.
