Countries today recognize the challenges facing older people in a rapidly ageing world and attempt to seize opportunities associated with the ageing phenomenon. As a result, several Arab countries developed older persons policies and strategies.

However, older persons continue to face an increased risk of being left behind and policy making relating to older persons remains fragmented in most Arab countries and do not respond to the needs of older persons today nor prepare for the quickly increasing numbers and proportions of older persons in the near future.
