


















ESCWA Stories: An initiative for a better tomorrow!

The young people of today are the leaders of tomorrow. They are our hope for a better future. Therefore, the Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia (ESCWA) seeks to build a generation raised on the United Nations values, the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), and the principles of peace, justice and inclusion. These principles will shape the behaviour of our young people as they become the future leaders of the world.

As sustainable development ideals are not always taught to young people in accessible ways, ESCWA stepped in to reduce this gap by publishing the ESCWA Stories comic book in 2021. The book narrates the adventures of six Arab young people who represent ESCWA. United by their faith in a brighter tomorrow, they work to achieve development in their neighbourhood, mirroring the work ESCWA undertakes to achieve the SDGs in the Arab region. The narrators are a child and her grandfather; their intergenerational dialogue represents the continued past-to-future concept of sustainable development.

In the pilot phase of the initiative, the book was distributed to 750 students across seven schools in Lebanon. After a year of creative work and extracurricular activities with the ESCWA Stories team, students were invited to ESCWA Headquarters in Beirut where, inspired by the ESCWA Stories, they let their talents in drawing, painting, performing, dancing, singing and writing shine!

In The 2022-2023 school year, ESCWA is expanding the project and sharing its message with over 7000 students in Lebanon, Jordan and Kuwait. The aspiration is to cover the entire Arab region in the future.

How will the initiative's goals be achieved?

As with the pilot phase, the comic book will continue to mainstream the United Nations values and the SDG principles in school curriculums. This will instil the new generation with the values and principles needed to build a flourishing society, economy and environment

Inspired by the ESCWA Stories, students with visual and learning disabilities developed the comic book in Braille.

Al Hadi Institute for Deaf, Blind and Learning Disabilities, Lebanon In 2022-2023, ESCWA will expand the initiative. It will continue to work with the seven pilot schools, partnering with an additional nine schools in Lebanon and several more in Jordan and Kuwait. These will include public and private schools, educational institutions in underprivileged areas, and those that work with orphans and students with disabilities.

Every year, a new volume of the ESCWA Stories will be published, so that the children of the region grow up alongside the comic book characters.

The pilot established a partnership between ESCWA, the Lebanese National Commission for the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) and the UNESCO Associated Schools Network, aimed at facilitating the delivery of the ESCWA Stories initiative in schools.


